Bishop's Palace (South Wing)

Hartlebury Castle Locomotive Nameplate

As you exit the Long Gallery, turn around to see this wonderful nameplate used between 1950-63.

Hurd Library

Added to the Castle in 1782, this is the only Anglican bishop's library with the books remaining on the original shelves in the room specifically built for them.

The Secret Wardrobe

Be sure to open the wardrobe in Maria's Boudoir, you never know what lies beyond...

Worcestershire County Museum (North Wing)

Victorian Schoolroom

Put yourself in a Victorian child's shoes as you sit at original wooden desks to learn your 3Rs!

Lavish Living exhibition

Step back into the 1950s with beautiful fashions of the era, a typical 50s living room interior and a fabulous jukebox.

Mappe of Fairyland

There are many treasures to be found in the toys and games gallery, including the wonderful Victorian Mappe of Fairyland with its intricate detail of an imaginary land.

Mulberry Trees

The two mulberry trees in the Orchard Terrace date back to the mid 1700s. They were uncovered during the restoration work in 2016, amazingly still alive!

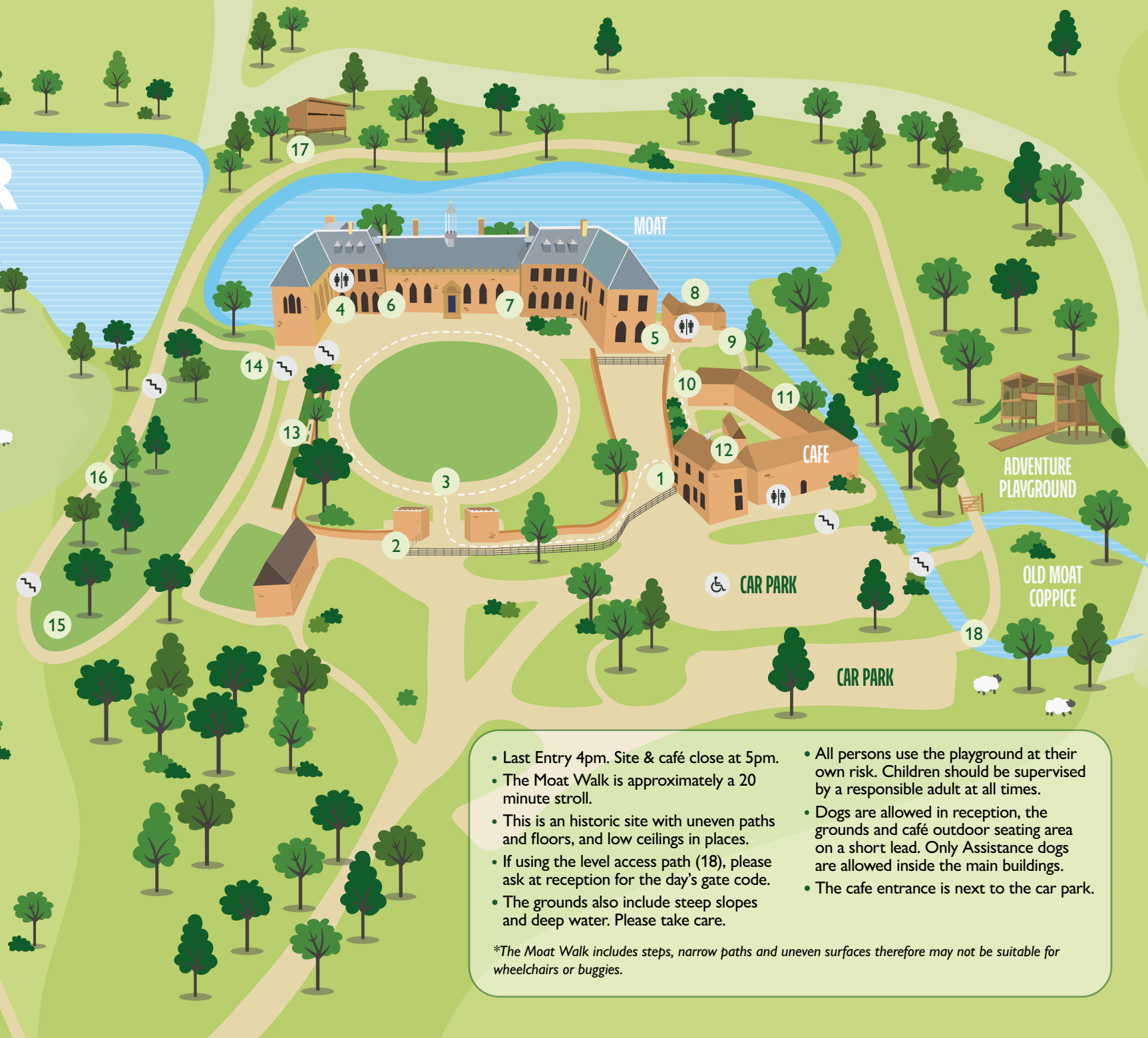

- Last Entry 4pm. Site & café close at 5pm.
- The Moat Walk is approximately a 20 minute stroll.
- This is an historic site with uneven paths and floors, and low ceilings in places.
- If using the level access path (18), please ask at reception for the day's gate code.
- The grounds also include steep slopes and deep water. Please take care.

- All persons use the playground at their own risk. Children should be supervised by a responsible adult at all times.
- Dogs are allowed in reception, the grounds and café outdoor seating area on a short lead. Only Assistance dogs are allowed inside the main buildings.
- The cafe entrance is next to the car park.
